

## **Join NEWSTAR for “The Day at EAA”**

On Friday April 21<sup>st</sup> 2006, come with us as we explore the world of aviation at the Experimental Aircraft Association’s Airventure Museum and complex.

After we pick you up at the Paper Valley Radisson Hotel we’ll head for Oshkosh, home of the EAA. At the EAA our first stop will be the Airventure Museum. Moving at your own pace, you will enjoy the museum’s collection of over 100 historic airplanes, artifacts, exhibits, 5 movie theaters and interactive displays, all designed to allow you to follow the intriguing tale of manned flight from the Wright Brothers’ “Flyer” to the supersonic fighter planes of today... and beyond!

After a light picnic style lunch, we’ll tour the Pioneer Airport, a unique “living history” recreation of what airports were like during the early days of air travel. More than 50 vintage airplanes are displayed in seven period hangars designed to take you back to aviation’s “Golden Age” of the 1920’s and 30’s. Most of all, pioneer airport is a place to savor the sights and sounds of vintage flying machines in their “natural habitat”.

After Pioneer Airport we will be treated to a special behind the scenes guided tour of the EAA’s state of the art aircraft maintenance facility. This facility, which is closed to the general public, is where the EAA meticulously restores and maintains its priceless collection of vintage and one of a kind aircraft.

After our full day we will get you back to the Radisson Paper Valley Hotel in time to relax and prepare for Friday night’s convention activities.

The price for this event is \$40.00 per person. This includes transportation, admissions and lunch.
